The two stamps inclosed were sent to me by one of the correspondents. You can use them, whereas they would not be accepted on mail sent from America.

If there are any questions, do not hesitate to write and ask them. While this is a world-wide program involving much work, with the able assistance of people in other nations - such as you are giving in Japan - I hope before the summer is finished to be able to carry out the plan of regular monthly correspondence with each co-worker as in the past, this will be done with many copies of the same letter being made so that the same information goes to each, and goes out to them all at the same time.

Incidently, it has been suggested that I make a tape recording for the co-workers rather than writing letters. This would be somewhat slower reaching them because I would make one tape and send it to Mexico from where it would be copied off and sent to Brazil where Dr. Buhler would copy it and send it on to England, and so on and on until finally it would be returned to me. May I have your reaction to such a plan? We have 60-cycle current here. Do you have that in Japan, and do you have a tape recorder; or would such a program be impractical for you?
